Dear Families

Welcome back to Term 2! I trust you had the opportunity to enjoy the break from the routines of school and are ready to tackle the term ahead. The children have settled in well to their first week back.

At the end of last term our school was able to donate a large amount of tables and chairs to schools in Fiji. The Catholic Schools Office (CSO) collected our excess furniture following changes to Stage 3 and Library and shipped it all off in a container. The CSO has expressed their gratitude to our school community for the donation.

Following a trial in Term 1 with some Year 6 students, I have granted permission for Year 6 to ride their bicycles to school. This arrangement is only for Year 6 students who have signed a safety contract between home and school. The constraints of storage, school access and traffic mean that we need to restrict the riding of bicycles.

Traffic management at St Kieran's is an ongoing and serious issue. At stake is the safety of every one of our children. We cannot afford to compromise our children's safety for our own convenience. There are two concerns in Gordon Street. The first is the use of the driveway outside the Year 1R classroom. The driveway encroaches the footpath and when used, blocks clear access for pedestrians. Vehicles sometimes use it as a turning point, either reversing in or approaching head on. Young children are not always visible and at risk of being killed. This applies to my second concern; cars using residential driveways as turning points at drop off or pick up. Please use the designated car spaces in Gordon Street and do not use the driveways for parking or turning.

Robokids has informed the school that due to staffing issues, they will be unable to offer after school robotics classes this term. If circumstances change, they will inform the school. School robotic classes are unaffected and will continue as planned.

I look forward to seeing as many of our mums as possible to the Mother's Day breakfast next Friday. Thank you in advance to the dads who have offered to help with serving.

I ask your cooperation with online bookings such as the Athletics Carnival, Mother's Day Breakfast etc. Please ensure that you have booked or entered your child(ren) by the due date. Late orders or entries make it very difficult for organisers to complete programs or orders accurately. There are two bookings that need to be completed by today or Monday. Your cooperation would be greatly appreciated.

STAGE 1

Kindergarten God is our Creator - The Creation story with thanks to God our creator

Year 4 Mary – A Woman of Faith – Discipleship focus

STAGE 3

Parables of Jesus: A focus on the New Testament stories where Jesus teaches through parables. Students study the meaning of the parables in Hebrew times and their relevance to their lives.

It is possible to see the development of the "Creation" theme throughout the primary years of Religious Education as students are challenged to take on greater responsibility for care the environment they live in. There is also a focus on Sacraments for Years 2 and 3 as they prepare to celebrate their First Holy Communion and Confirmation.

The Hub provides a new era of flexible learning

STUDENTS at a school in Manly Vale are leading the way in "21st century learning".

Since the unveiling of The Hub at St Kieran's Catholic School in January, Year 5 and 6 pupils have become more confident, collaborative and independent in their work.

That's according to principal Michael Gallagher, who said The Hub — the school's former library and technology centre — was designed and transformed into an open space classroom for 86 students to change the way primary pupils learn.

"While the kids receive instruction at the beginning of the day, they have more flexibility in how they learn and present their work," he said.

"They have the option of working independently and in groups, and they have the opportunity of moving to areas of the room where they feel comfortable learning, rather than being stuck at a desk all day. "There are standing

"There are standing desks and quiet spaces the space really is for 21st century learning."

Mr Gallagher explained that while students are divided between three teachers, classes occasionally work together, depending on the tasks at hand.

"Co-operative teaching is another reason why we moved forward with constructing and delivering The Hub," he said.

"Teachers are putting their skills together to provide the best possible outcome for the students, with a real focus on leadership and responsibility in preparation for high school.

"So far the children have taken much more responsibility to learn — it's not 100 per cent perfect, don't get me wrong, but it's a much more engaged workspace."

Mr Gallagher said St Kieran's was open to other schools visiting the space, as he believed it was a positive way forward in learning.


