Dear Families

Assessments are an integral part of teaching and learning in the classroom. Assessing students' knowledge, skills and understanding allows for the teacher to monitor the progress of each child in their learning. The assessment measures areas of growth and looks for obstacles in the way of the student's progress. The **Mathematical Assessment Interview (MAI)** that is taking place today and on Monday allows the teacher to gain an insight into each child's mathematical thinking and understanding. Being an effective mathematician is more than being able to complete mathematical challenges; rather it is about having a sense of number, estimating and a conceptual understanding of the place of number in the real world. The results of the MAI will assist the teachers to adjust their teaching to meet the needs of all the students in the classroom.

During the week I had a visit from to Northern Beaches Council traffic representatives in response to concerns raised by the school to congestion on King Street at afternoon pick up time and occasionally during morning drop off. Many of the issues are being compounded by the building site on the corner, especially with partial road closures during peak periods. The two council officers, with the assistance of Juliette Cronin, our parent traffic committee rep, were able to observe the congestion during the afternoon. They have come up with some possible solutions, subject to approval by local residents and the council's traffic management committee. Hopefully, we will receive a response in the next few weeks with improvements being put in place. In the meantime, I ask that you continue to be vigilant in following the procedures that are in place for drop off and pick up. **Our children's safety depends on every member of our school community adhering to the procedures that have been put into place**. I thank you all for your cooperation with this matter.

Finally, today you will have received an invite to the P&F Welcome Drinks on Saturday 4 March at Wakehurst Golf Club. It is a wonderful opportunity to meet new families as well as reconnecting with our current families. I look forward to meeting more families and hope that many of you will be able to make it to this important social gathering.

International Football Exchange

A parent in our school, Robert Juric, has been involved with a charity organisation called International Football Exchange (IFE). IFE collects unwanted football gear, whether new or used, to be donated to underprivileged children and youth in developing countries. The mission of the charity is to change lives by breaking down financial barriers and bringing happiness through giving football gear a second life. So far IFE have donated over 6,400 items of football gear to beneficiaries in Thailand, Cambodia, Liberia and Kenya. In 2016 IFE worked with the SALT Academy in Cambodia as well as an organisation called Children of the Forest that operates an orphanage in a remote area of Thailand called Sangkhlaburi. Support for the orphanage is also linked to a worldwide church group, who make regular visits to the area and have even set up a local hospital there, funded by donors in Australia.

IFE provides football jerseys and soccer boots for the children in the orphanage who participate in a football program that first began nine years ago, on a small dirt pitch within their site at Sangkhlaburi. Fast forward to 2017 and there are now over 100 children directly involved through playing football, three boys and three girls teams, with many more

supporters of the teams. They participate in various tournaments across Sangkhlaburi which includes hosting their own annual Futsal Christmas Cup. You can read here for more information about their magnificent work in Thailand. In 2017 IFE will also be working on a new donation project for East Africa where the aim is to reach over 1,000 beneficiaries.

IFE is currently seeking donations of football gear such as boots, balls, team uniforms, tracksuits, training equipment, basically any football gear that can be given a SECOND LIFE! To learn more, check their Facebook Page (@InternationalFootballExchange), or view the promotional video.

If you would like to contribute to this initiative then on FRIDAY 17 FEBRUARY students may wear their favourite football/soccer/sports jersey and bring either an old jersey/football or soccer boots/shorts to donate to International Football Exchange.


