We had an amazing turn out of parents attending the P&F meeting last week. There were around 30 parents in all. Following some well deserved nibbles and wine, Ms Bombardieri and I presented a slide presentation highlighting our achievements as a school community. The presentation is linked here for your information and enjoyment. Our main achievement is that we reconnected and engaged as a school community after a long period of school restrictions and home learning. We have so much to be grateful for as a vibrant reunited faith filled school community: the students, wonderful teachers and staff, parents, School Advisory, Fr Dave and the parish team. Thank you to the P&F Committee that planned wonderful opportunities throughout the year for social and fundraising activities. Your relentless efforts to bring people together and celebrate our warm and welcoming community makes it special for us all.

Ms Bombardieri announced two new initiatives for teaching and learning in 2023. Teachers will have allocated weekly time to collaborate and plan in stage teaching teams. This enables teachers to have quality student data informed professional conversations and planning time to further support all students and their learning - supported, core and extension. Additionally, the teachers will incorporate the professional learning they gained through the Mini Certificate of Gifted Education course completed this year. This course skilled teachers to implement differentiated practices for high achieving students in their classrooms.

I communicated at the meeting stage 1 of the playground improvements commencing in term 1 of next year. This comprises the resurfacing of the concrete playground with a non slip coloured coating and line markings for student play. Additional physical and creative/imaginative play items will be purchased to enhance social and team play opportunities. We look forward to this improvement financially supported by Catholic School Broken Bay (CSBB) and \$4,500 donated to the school from P&F fundraising. This project is a joint venture between CSBB and fundraising. Well done everyone!

On Tuesday next week, there will be a whole school performance called Sticks and Stones. The performers of this production will teach the students anti- bullying strategies to keep safe and build positive behaviours that support wellbeing for self and others. The performance will take place in the hall in the afternoon on Tuesday. I'm sure the students will feel empowered after this performance.

As it has been a few years since we have enjoyed carols at St Kieran's so I will take the opportunity to outline the format.

Students are encouraged to come dressed in Christmas clothing. Angels, shepherds, red and green, tinsel, stars are all acceptable.

4.45 pm Safety officers arrive for a briefing and begin to supervise the car park.
5.00 pm Gates open and families may set up on the grass area.
5:30 pm Carols commence

The car park is an area of great concern as families walk through the car park to enter the playground. Please exercise the greatest of care and be highly aware that children are around. Safety Officers will be on duty in this area at the beginning of the evening.

The Parent Band will set up in front of Yr. 1 classrooms on the handball court and students will sing their carol from the area in front of the blackboard. These areas are a no-go zone unless you are performing. There are leads, equipment and instruments which can be easily damaged.

Families are encouraged to bring picnic rugs and low beach chairs to sit on. If you do bring taller picnic chair, could you please sit at the back of the playground. No alcohol or smoking is permitted on the school grounds.

Parents are responsible for the supervision of their children and sit in family groups. Students are not to move to unsupervised areas of the playground or to go upstairs. Parent volunteer Safety Officers have been asked to direct children back to their parents.

Classes will be called to meet their teacher near the bubblers one song prior to their item.

Thank you to the P & F for organising the decoration of the playground, a band of parents and friends and parents who will be acting as Safety Officers. Now all we need is a wonderful balmy evening.
