Jo's Chocolate Chip Muffin Recipe

Makes 48 4 cups of SR flour 1 cup of caster sugar 1 cup of chocolate chips ¾ of cup of coco 250g of butter 1 ½ cups of milk 4 eggs



Shift the flour and coco into a large bowl, add the sugar and chocolate chips. Melt the butter, add the milk, and eggs in a separate jug, whisk and then add to your dry mixture.

Place in a heated fan forced oven at 180 degrees and cook for 10 minutes or until you smell that they are cooked.
