Dear Families,

Two years ago I was fortunate to have spent some time in Ireland and visit Clonmacnoise, the monastic community established by St Kieran on the picturesque Shannon River. Irish monastic sites such as Clonmacnoise became the first universities and preserved and instilled the classical teachings in Europe. Irish monasteries continuously produced large numbers of missionary teachers and scholars in Europe, and became the centre of classical scholarship until the Viking invasions from 875 onwards.

There are many legends and stories connected to St Kieran (Ciaran). What is known and recorded is that St Kieran was a man of prayer, of fasting and labour, trained in all the disciplined ways, humble and full of faith. However, Kieran's administration of his monastery was short lived; he was struck down by the plague and died on 9 September 544. Dying before he was thirty-three, it is all the more remarkable that the reputation and fame of his great monastic community lasted for so many centuries. Today, pilgrims like myself, travel to Clonmacnoise to visit the shrines and ruins and reflect on this once great monastic community.

Each year the students and staff at St Kieran's school, Manly Vale, celebrate their patron saint by having a special prayerful liturgy followed by a mini-fete. The children, supported by their teachers, set up a variety of fun activities where they experience being part of their own vibrant learning community.
