Dear Families

The Lenten Season begins this week with Ash Wednesday marking the start of the preparation for Easter. Traditionally, Lent is a penitential season of prayer, self-denial and helping others. Father Francis spoke at Mass on Wednesday of getting ready for Lent. He told the children that preparing for Lent is like applying SPF40 sunscreen!

S is for Sharing (almsgiving), **P** is for Prayer and **F** is for Fasting! This simple analogy speaks very clearly as to what the Season is about. At the conclusion of his homily, Father Francis told us to journey through Lent with a "joyous" attitude.

Last year's Year 6 class was engaged by the Northern Beaches Council to work with a team of consultants in designing a new play-space for Manly Dam. The class was visited twice as part of the consultation and their ideas were in the design. The concept is open for feedback, however, comments close tomorrow! We were only informed this week.
