

# **Religious Education**

Catholic Mission – Walk 4 Water: Sore fingers and a big walk on a hot and sticky day

Following three weeks of preparation students from years 3 -6 walked to Manly Dam to collect water, emulating the trek of many children from poorer nations in the world. To prepare for this day students have engaged with the **Service Learning Model** which encompasses three stages.

Head: In Week 1, Stages 2 & 3 attended a presentation about Social Justice in the world. Using the video "If the World were a Village of 100 People" the children explored the inequalities which exist across many aspects of life, education, fresh water, food security and shelter to name a few.

Heart: During Week 2 our teachers and students unpacked Scripture that spoke about "Living Life to the full" and "Sharing with the community". Students explored Social Justice through the lens of Christianity. The role of The Church in trying to alleviate injustices was also explored with an emphasis on Catholic Mission and Ethiopia.

Hands: During weeks 2 & 3 students collected sponsorship money for their Walk for Water. In week 3 students made their move walking to collect water. The Walk was designed to allow students to walk in the footsteps of another and experience the role of many children in the world.

Thank you to the students and teachers who participated in the Walk 4 Water last Friday. Whilst at the dam Miss Williams spoke to the children about the long term ramifications of children having to carry water, often dirty, to their families each and every day of their lives.

The day was hot and sticky, and the hills seemed to get longer on the return trip. Tired and achy fingers carried the containers of water. Many students expressed how difficult a task it was and how undrinkable the water was. Filtered clean tap water in our houses and schools will never be taken so lightly again. Water was poured onto plants upon return to school.
