Now teachers support learning, not always through use of traditional text books but using their capabilities within a curriculum that allows for 21st Century learners to collaborate, problem solve and use critical thinking and creativity.

We welcomed today our 2019 Kindergarten students and their parents for the second transition session. Student Transport 2019

School student applications for 2019 open from Monday, 15 October 2018.

Students progressing to Year 3 and Year 7 do not need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.

Religious Education

What is Catholic Mission?

Two Scripture passages which help us talk about our Catholic Mission include:

MATTHEW 28:18-20

Then Jesus came near and said to them, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age. This passage tells us Jesus was entrusted with God's Mission and now he is entrusting the mission to his followers.

JOHN 20:21

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you."

The Mission modules our children are exploring carry titles such as: 'Living in the way of Jesus', 'Sharing with others like Jesus did', 'Loving God and others like Jesus', 'Reaching out with Jesus', 'A loving Mission of Service' and 'Creating the Kingdom of God by reaching out to the marginalised'.

The key ideas embedded in the children's learning include:

Kingdom of God: Matthew's Gospel shows Jesus working very hard to explain to those listening that he is speaking about both the here and now and the future; that the Reign of God starts here and is completed in heaven: that what we do is inextricably linked with the completion of the Kingdom. In his parables, explanations



and action He makes it explicit that the Kingdom is a kingdom of justice and peace. The task for the Christian is to build such a Kingdom here and now and enjoy its fruits in heaven.

Equality in the eyes of God: Jesus showed God's love to all by reaching out in a particular way to those whom society marginalised. Mainstream Judaism in the 1st century spurned those who collaborated, mixed with or benefited from the Romans who occupied the country. For this reason tax collectors and prostitutes were alienated. But others too were excluded from Jewish society: lepers and those with mental disorders. Women, in general, had little status and women who were without a husband had even less. Jesus reached out to all these and called them to share in God's kingdom. The task for us is to identify the marginalised in our society. Identifying the marginalised in our own world is the on-going task of the disciple of Jesus. It can be easy for contemporary Australians to get caught up in humanitarian ventures but ignore the marginalised around us.

Christian Mission: Today's missionaries focus on providing loving services to the poor that might not otherwise be provided: health care, education and community building. In Australia and overseas this will often mean searching for solutions to the long-term effects of dislocation resulting from colonisation in previous centuries. Catholic missions are more involved in extending the Kingdom through action rather than proselytising.



Catholic Agencies: Organisations such as Caritas, Catholic Mission, St Vincent de Paul and Mission Australia carry on work which has been going on for centuries. Today they are doing the work that we in the Western world consider should be done by governments. The focus should be on exposing children particularly to the work of Catholic agencies so that children in Catholic schools know that the mission of the Church is being carried on in very practical ways by the Church.

Catholic Discipleship: Students are called to be disciples of Jesus in their words and actions.
