#### **Dear Families**

On Monday I had the pleasure of attending the **Fred Hollows Humanitarian Awards** at Parliament House in Sydney where Ellie D (Year 5) was recognised for the support given to her brother (an ex St K ieran's student) who has leukaemia. Ellie was one of a select group of students from across NSW who had been awarded for their acts of kindness and compassion. Ellie was presented her certificate by Gabby Hollows, the wife of the late Fred Hollows, and the Minister for Education, the Hon. Rob Stokes. Congratulations to Ellie on this well-deserved award and thank you to her teachers who nominated her.



There is the possibility next Wednesday or Thursday of industrial action by teachers in Catholic systemic schools across NSW.
