I encourage our families to consciously follow at least one of the Lenten practices of Sharing, Fasting and Prayer. Thank you to everyone who was able to attend and the staff for their presence.

During the week we had members of the B-Line (Transport NSW) assist some of our students in planting a variety of native shrubs in the garden beds in the middle of the playground. The Liturgy and Environment team members, along with their Kinder buddies, helped beautify these empty spaces.

Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others
Fast from grudges and be reconciled.
Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.

Rice Day

We are all aware that many children in the world live on a cup of rice a day. In order to share our wealth, almsgiving, and by way of fasting, we are offering students the opportunity to go hungry for part of their day. We are not asking students to starve but simply feel hungry for a few hours. Students are under no obligation to participate in Rice Day.



Parents can discuss with their children the extent to which they fast. For example our kindy and yr 1 students may simply replace part of their lunch with rice whilst older students may have choose to have a normal breakfast, miss morning tea, have rice for lunch then a main meal at night. The extent to which your child replaces food for rice or fasts in some small way is up to their parents.

- Thursday 8 March for Years 4, 5 and 6 students will be able to pre- order a cup of rice for lunch from the canteen. The cost per cup is \$1.00 with all money going to Catholic Mission. Please use the canteen online ordering system QKR! to order and pay for a cup of rice.
