### This Week at St Kieran's

I appreciate the time and thank the parents who attended the parent session on Tuesday evening on the Advantages of Boys Continuing to Stage 3 at St Kieran's. We hope you found the session informative in assuring you the completion of primary education is in the best interest of your son.

Key summary points discussed follow:

- Trend data shows that students learn best in co-educational school settings from Kinder to Year 12.
- Completion of primary education in one school setting following 7 years of foundational education best prepares children for secondary education. This completes a rite of passage in accordance with the stages of child development. This makes for a smooth and easy transition to the next phase of schooling, secondary education.
- Primary school teachers are the specialists in the primary years and secondary teachers are specialists of students from 13-18 years of age.
- St Kieran's offers a strong student leadership program including leadership of team groups and kinder buddy opportunities.
   Students benefit in confidence and self esteem as these offerings support them to flourish in secondary school.

- Students need to experience being the big fish in the little pond in primary school.
- There is a memorandum of understanding between St Kieran's and St Augustine College. That is, your enrolment for Year 5 can be deferred to Year 7 if you wish your son to attend.

Parents are fortunate to have the choice of excellent schools in the Northern Beaches, therefore we encourage families to choose the school that is the best fit for your child. At St Kieran's we believe the decision to complete the primary years at our school completes and best prepares your child not only for secondary but the future. The innovative and collaborative approach and pedagogy in Stage 3 and The Hub space is the ideal setting for the preparation for life long skills.

I commend and thank Mrs Erika
Burmeister and Mrs Jane Silcock and their respective sons, Jacob and Charlie, for sharing their perspective and experience in choosing to keep their boys at St Kieran's. Their speeches were compelling and well received by participants. Jane and Erika are more than happy to have a chat with you if you have any questions. We also thank Mr Michael Reid, principal of St Paul's College Manly who presented the secondary school perspective. Michael is a tremendous supporter of the benefits of the completion of primary education as a stepping stone to secondary.

## Learning and Teaching

The Leadership Program for our Year 6 students encourages and develops leadership skills in all our students. It is based on a belief that all students develop confidence when given an opportunity to lead. - Develops individual capacity to lead and influence others in a responsible manner
- Links strongly with learning about citizenship and the process involved in a democracy
- Provides opportunities for the children to learn about and exercise the rights and responsibilities of participating in a community that values social justice
- Gives children a direct role in decision making and how they can have a positive effect on the school community they are part of
- Gives senior primary children a sense of vision, purpose and working towards this vision

On Monday next week, all teams will meet with their teacher/mentor in order to continue the initiatives commenced in Term 1.




