Today's Staff Development Day was spent on the analysis of assessment data collected in the first few weeks of the year. The data includes the Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI) results as well as the Best Start data from Kindergarten. Through the analysis, teachers plan classroom structures designed to meet the needs of all students. Consideration is also given to the social and emotional learning (SEL) needs of the students. The parent teacher meetings at the end of the term will give you the chance to discuss further the needs of your child.

Last night teachers from across the Diocese of Broken Bay gathered for the Missioning Mass led by Bishop Peter Comensoli. The vocation of teaching centres on supporting the faith development of the children as well as their academic, social, physical and emotional growth. This responsibility isn't taken lightly by our teachers and as Bishop Peter remarked, our Mission is to support families who are the primary educators of our children.

Our new P&F team has been working hard behind the scenes in preparation for next Monday's meeting, as well as the welcoming drinks evening at Wakehurst Golf Club on Saturday 10 March. At the P&F meeting I will be addressing a variety of matters which we will be focusing on this year such as our School Improvement Plan (SIP), a review of our behaviour management guidelines, a review of our school's homework policy and an update on the Stage 3 learning space.

Thank you to the parents who have volunteered their time to act as guides at next Tuesday's Open Morning and to those who assisted in distributing flyers to pre-schools. Prospective families in our community will be looking to see what makes St Kieran's a school worthy for their children. Congratulations to our representative swimming team who gained second place at Wednesday's interschool carnival. Teachers praised the enthusiasm, sportsmanship and achievements of all our competitors. A special mention to the children who broke existing records in three events.
