The Season of Lent began this week with Ash Wednesday. Many classes joined the parish community in marking this special day while the younger grades received the ashes in a class liturgy. Lent is the time when we prepare for the celebration of Easter; we do this through three different acts. These are prayer, self-denial (abstinence) and helping others (almsgiving). Traditionally, Lent is a "sombre" time of the year, but as Father Paul said at Mass on Wednesday, echoing the words of Pope Francis, there is no reason why we cannot do these acts with a sense of joy. I hope you and your family are able to consciously partake in these penitential acts during Lent.

Our Liturgy Leaders represented our Year 6 leaders at a gathering with Bishop Peter Comensoli at the Light of Christ Centre at Waitara yesterday. Primary school student leaders from across the Diocese gathered to take part in a special Mass and to hear about the meaning of leadership through a Catholic lens. Year 5 students spent a day during the week being challenged by coding and robotics. There was some amazing work being done by the students in getting their robots to move, dance and synchronize in groups. Other classes will have the opportunity to take part in this activity later in the year.

St Kieran's was a very close second place out of the thirteen schools that were represented. It was wonderful to see the terrific sportsmanship amongst our swimmers and that of the other schools.
