Dear Families

Yesterday you received a second letter from the Director of Schools, Mr Peter Hamill, in regard to school funding. In this letter he expressed his assurance that school fees would only increase between 1.5% and 3% each year for the next five years. I spoke with Mr Hamill personally yesterday where he gave me the same reassurance about fees and stressed once again that no child should be denied a Catholic education due to the inability to pay the full cost of fees.

Next week Mr Hamill is visiting our school to meet the staff, students and to view *The Hub*, our dynamic Stage 3 learning space. On Tuesday evening he also spoke at the *Catholic School Parents (CSP)* annual meeting where some of our P&F executive attended. He talked about the future of Catholic education in Australia, particularly about the challenges and some of the new directions. *The Hub* is one example of how education is changing towards a new way of learning. Mr James Griffin MP will also be visiting the school next week to meet our Stage 3 students and to speak to them about leadership.

Congratulations to our representative swimmers who competed at the NSW Catholic Primary Schools meet at Homebush on Wednesday. They were among swimmers from across eleven dioceses in NSW who were competing to go to the state championships at the end of the term. I was fortunate enough to be there to see them all do themselves and Broken Bay proud.

This week we received the wonderful news that Mrs Vanessa Clifford and her husband Dan welcomed the arrival of their new baby daughter Scarlett. We wish them much happiness and joy for the future and pray for a wonderful future ahead.


