Dear Families

The **Season of Lent** concludes this weekend with the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday. Over the last forty days or so we have been preparing for this joyous occasion by following the advice of Fr Francis, who on Ash Wednesday suggested that Lent is the time for "applying our SPF 40"! This meant that during the **40** days of Lent we were to **S**hare, **P**ray and **F**ast. These actions allow us to journey with Christ over the forty days leading up to His entry into Jerusalem and the events leading to His crucifixion on Good Friday. This week our children and teachers have been following this journey starting on Monday with Kindergarten "singing Hosanna" as Jesus entered Jerusalem. Today we remembered the other stories of Holy Week up until the death of Jesus on the Cross. I hope that during this long weekend in memory of Jesus' passion, that your family is able to spend some time in joining our North Harbour Parish community in remembering the journey of Jesus to His resurrection on Easter Sunday.

This week we were visited by two distinguished guests; on Tuesday the Director of Schools, Mr Peter Hamill spent a couple of hours meeting to discuss progress at St Kieran's and to visit *The Hub*. Our second guest was the Member for Manly, James Griffin MP. Mr Griffin's visit was the second since his election last year. During his visit he spent time with Stage 3 interacting with the students and discussing their Science projects which are dealing with the real-life issues facing the Northern Beaches in the areas of infrastructure, environment and land use. He was extremely impressed with the knowledge and problem solving skills of the students and the insight they had into the various issues.



We had a large number of parents visit the classrooms on Monday morning to see Literacy lessons in action. It was wonderful to see so many of our parents and grandparents interested in the learning of our students. Stage 3 parents were also invited back on Monday evening for the opportunity to hear from the teachers about the new contemporary learning space. Thank you to all those who were able to attend the evening.

Congratulations to those students who have made significant achievements in representative sport recently, namely our boys swimming relay team who will be competing in the NSW State Swimming Carnival in Week 11 and

to Opal Bird who has been selected as captain of the MWNA State representative team. We wish all our sporting representatives the best of luck.

One of our parents, Mr John McKee, originates from the South Coast township of Tathra which was recently ravaged by a bushfire that destroyed around 70 homes and damaged many more. John still has very close ties with the township through his parents, friends and his business.
