Before Ms Leong left on maternity leave she had been working with some classes on some impressive dance routines. Mr Waller will bring his own creative expertise when he starts next term.


Students will present a variety of songs, dances and short plays. Year Six have been working very hard on writing some plays in Italian to introduce the colours.


