For those of you who are available, this is a reminder that on <u>Monday morning</u> we will be having <u>OPEN</u> <u>CLASSROOMS from 9.00 am to 9.30 am.</u>

The focus for this OPEN is Literacy and we invite you in to the classrooms to see a Literacy Block in action. Of course then as follow up to this, a Literacy Workbook or Sample will be sent home on Friday for you to look through with your child over the weekend.

We had the first of our Literacy Parent Ed Sessions on Tuesday night in the iCentre. It is always pleasing to see so many of our parents attend these sessions as we value very strongly the opportunity to **Equip** our parents with knowledge and information. The teaching and learning Curriculum is very different now to when many of our parents were at school...and it continues to evolve!! By doing this we know that parents are better able to **Embrace** and understand the changes and **Engage** with their child/ren's learning. A very big THANK YOU to Mary Brown who delivered the session and to our Kindergarten teachers, Emily Channell and Vanessa Ryan who both attended.

As you are no doubt aware **Attendance Codes** have changed quite <u>significantly</u> over the past year or two. Teachers now are required by law to adhere to the very strict codes, guidelines and procedures for keeping records of student attendance and this has also had an impact on parents who now need to ensure they are notifying the school of absences appropriately. This has certainly made the things a little more complicated, but in an effort to "streamline" the process and make things a little easier, we have **uploaded all the forms for Absences** onto our **WEBSITE.** This means that parents are able to access the forms, print and fill them in ready for sending to school when required. Below is a summary of all the forms available as well as an explanation of the procedures for each of the forms. <u>Please read this carefully</u> as it will be extremely useful for you when assisting the school to keep accurate records of Absences. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank parents who have been very diligent in communicating with the school regarding Absences!

SUMMARY OF FORMS AVAILABLE TO REQUEST/EXPLAIN ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL.

These forms are all available on the school website. The following is a brief summary of the *purpose* of each of these forms as well as the procedures required for filling in the forms. The school asks that you read the explanations carefully so that correct forms are filled in for absences.

FULL DAY ABSENCE

Full Day/s Absence form is to be filled in for 1-9 consecutive day absences. Reason is to be cited on the form (Tick Box or explanation) Form must be signed by the parent and returned to school. Student must present the form to the Office before school (either on <u>return from leave</u> or where reason for leave is known before actual leave, then <u>prior to leave</u>) NB* Absences of more than five consecutive days will be communicated to the Principal.

IMPORTANT* Absences of 10 or more days or absences relating to employment in the Entertainment Industry OR participation in an elite Sporting Event require completion of **FORM A1**.

PARTIAL ABSENCES

Partial Absence – Early Departure form is to be filled when student is required to leave school before the end of the school day.

Partial Absence – Late Arrival form is to be filled in when student is late for commencement of the school day. Reason is to be cited on the form (Tick Box or explanation)

Form must be signed by the parent and handed in to the School Office for processing. Please note^{**} When arriving at school late (and going to the office to hand in the Partial Absence-Late Arrival form) your child will need to accompany you to the office <u>before</u> going to class.

PARTIAL ABSENCE (eg, Leave early and return)

The **Leave and Return** form is to be filled in when a student is collected by a parent during school hours in order to attend an appointment and then *returned* to school <u>before the end of the school day</u>. This means that the child is absent for a few hours during the day.

This form is to be filled in and presented to the School Office on departure. <u>A note will be made of the time of departure</u>. The parents will then be asked to keep the note until returning to school. On return the note **must** then be handed in to the School Office. A note will be taken of the return time and the note will be filed.

Lent is the season of the Church year leading up to Easter. Lent is preceded by Shrove (Pancake) Tuesday, begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Maundy (Holy) Thursday.

The purpose of Lent is to prepare for the death of Christ on Good Friday and his resurrection on Easter Sunday through 40 days of prayer, fasting, repentance, almsgiving and self-denial. The 40 days mirror Christ's fasting in the desert before he began his public ministry.

During Lent, Christians 'do penance' – that is, they make personal sacrifices. Doing penance helps us 'make right' our lives and relationships where we need to, so we become better persons and better reflections of God's love.

- Day 1: Start your day with 10 minutes in God's presence through e.g. prayer, reflection or meditation. (Family prayer suggestions are downloadable from the diocesan website www.dbb.org.au/family)
- Day 2: Tell family members you will be specially praying for them.
- Day 3: Fast from TV, computer or other technical devices you would usually use as part of your leisure time.
- **Day 4:** Decide as a family what good works you will support during Lent e.g. Catholic Mission, Project Compassion, St Vincent de Paul.
- Day 5: After Mass, discuss the homily as a family. What lessons did you take from it that you are going to put into practice in the coming week?
- Day 6: Give up a treat for a day or so, it might be one of your favourite foods.
- Day 7: Read a book about your faith. Discuss what you learn with your children.

School Fees

Please rest assured the only time your child's name will appear with a photo is in the year book or in our newsletter. If your child's photo is to be used in a local newspaper we would seek your permission to do so. Not signing the permission form excludes your child from the newsletter, the yearbook, photographs of our swimming carnival, grandparent's day, musical and other school events. We respect the right of parents not to allow their child to be photographed and ask parents not to post other students on social media without permission.



Traffic Volunteers

Dear parents,

I hope many of you have been able to take advantage of the wonderful new afternoon drive-through between the parish office and the church. The new system seems to be working really well and I think is making the afternoon dismissal process much easier for parents, teachers and students and better for King Street residents and users.

We currently have a roster of 1 parent volunteer and Terri Paterson each afternoon to help with the smooth running of the process. It is not feasible for Terri to continue to do this each afternoon as she has many after school work commitments.

We are calling for some extra volunteers to relieve Terri of this job in the afternoon.

What does a volunteer need to do?

- Collect a fluoro vest from the front office at 2.50pm.
- Stand at either the gates near the canteen to direct people through the cones, or
- Stand at the crossing to stop people crossing while the cars enter the drive-through zone.
- Return the vest to the office once most of the traffic has dispersed at approximately 3.05pm.

How long does the process take?

• From 2.50 – 3.05 – only 15 minutes and you're done!

How often would I be required?

• Once per week to start depending on number of volunteers. Hopefully once per fortnight or once per month if we get 4 volunteers each afternoon and as the process becomes clearer to families.

If we get 4 of volunteers per afternoon we can coordinate a roster where 2 people would be rostered per day every second week. This could work by volunteers helping on either the term's odd weeks or even weeks. Once we have the process running smoothly this may be reduced to 1 volunteer each afternoon and the volunteers would only be required once per month.

Please consider this helpful role as it does make a big difference to the smooth running of our afternoon dismissal which benefits the whole school and it's only for 15 minutes!



CATHOLIC SCHOOLS


- Catholic schools have provided quality education for Australian children since 1806
- There are 583 Catholic schools in NSW, 1 educating more than 251,000 students (or one in five NSW school students)
- Catholic education is one of the largest non-government employers in NSW with more than 27,000 staff, including more than 19,000 teachers
- Catholic schools are open to all students Catholic, non-Catholic, poor, wealthy, indigenous and those with a disability - and are therefore representative of the wider Australian society
- Enrolments of students with a disability and indigenous students have been the fastest growing components in NSW Catholic schools for the past 15 years

HOW THEY'RE FUNDED

- Catholic schools represent excellent value for money, educating at a lower cost per student than government schools and other non-government schools
- Catholic schools are funded by the Commonwealth (57.5%) and State Governments (19.7%), parental fees and other private fundraising (22.8%). Catholic schools therefore receive much less public funding than government schools
- NSW Catholic school parents paid more than \$1.1 billion in school fees and capital funding in 2012
- Catholic schools strive to keep fees low so that schools remain accessible. No child is ever denied a Catholic education because of their family's financial situation
