Dear Families

Welcome back to Term 4. I hope you and your family were able to enjoy some restful time together over the Spring break. It is hard to believe that we are already into the final term of the year.

The two “big ticket items” for review this year have been the school’s policies on Behaviour Management and Homework. The Behaviour Management Guidelines were completed at the end of Term 2 and during the second half of the year the staff has been reviewing the Homework Policy in light of their own beliefs, research, best-practice and parent input through the survey. On Monday we spent the day developing a revised policy that takes into consideration the vast spectrum of views, opinions and research. The resulting draft policy will be ready to be presented later in the term at the P&F meeting.

Yesterday I spent the afternoon and evening with the Year 5 students and their teachers at the Leadership Camp at Collaroy. Activities such as the challenge course, laser tag and the flying fox ensured the students (and teachers) were having a great time learning the skills of team work, encouragement and moving outside their comfort zone. The students were a credit to the school and their families and I am sure they will sleep very well this weekend.

As we move towards the end of the school year, there are often changes that occur in the staffing of a school. Fortunately we have been able to retain a teacher for 2019, ensuring that we have two kindergarten classes next year. Sadly though, some of our teachers will be leaving St Kieran’s at the end of the year or changing their work arrangements.

Mrs Wendy Rose will be transitioning to retirement over the next couple of years and will return to St Kieran's next year in a part-time capacity. Mrs Mary Brown has taken the position of Literacy Education Officer with the Catholic Schools Office but will occasionally be visiting St Kieran's to support the staff and parents with Literacy. Mrs Tracy Brown is making the big move interstate with her family and has secured a position at a school on the Sunshine Coast. Miss Laura Cronin is taking a break from full-time teaching to explore other interests but we will still see her during casual-teaching visits. These teachers have contributed many years to the St Kieran's community and will be sadly missed. Fortunately, most will continue to be associated with the school in varying capacities. A recruitment process has already begun and you will be kept informed of progress during the remainder of the term.

During the holidays I listened to a "conversation" on ABC radio about the parenting of boys from a mother's perspective. It was an excellent interview, well worth listening to. Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study

One of our Year 4 classes (4K) has been selected to take part in the *Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS)*. This will take place on Monday 5 November. TIMSS is an important educational research project investigating student achievement in Mathematics and Science. More than 60 countries, including Australia, are participating in this study. TIMSS is an important activity to keep us, as parents and citizens, informed about how our students in Australia are performing in comparison to their peers in other countries and to compare programs of study and teaching practices. We will be able to obtain current national and international information which will help improve the teaching and learning of **M**athematics and **S**cience in our country. There is no need for students to study specifically for the

assessment as it will not affect individual students' grades or progress in school. All data will be kept strictly confidential and no individual student or school will be identified in published data or reports.

Student Transport 2019

School student [applications](#) for 2019 open from Monday, 15 October 2018.

Students progressing to Year 3 and Year 7 **do not** need to re-apply **if** they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2018 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.
