Dear Families

Last Sunday's Year 2 Family Mass was a wonderful celebration of what it means to be part of a Catholic community. It was reassuring to see so many of our families, along with our parishioners, sharing in this Eucharistic celebration as one.

Fr John Sullivan shared in his homily the paradox of being a Christian in a world that focuses on the individual, money and fame and less on compassion, acceptance of others and giving. As Christians, we are called to be counter-cultural, to act in service to others. He quoted many examples in the gospels where these paradoxes are found e.g. "Blessed are the poor"; "Love your enemy"; "the last shall be first and the first will be last", to name just a few.

Yesterday I attended a principal meeting that started with prayer. The prayer reinforced Sunday's homily and as we are all leaders, in one form or another, I thought I would share this prayer as an example of how we are called to be counter-cultural in our lives.

The Gospel


We lead more by listening than by what we say

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

Last Friday we conducted our MAI (Mathematical Assessment Interview) one to one assessments with the students.

The Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI) is task-based, interactive, designed for young children, and enables progress to be measured in four whole number domains (Counting, Place Value, Strategies for Addition and Subtraction, and Strategies for Multiplication and Division) against a research-based framework of **Growth Points**. An additional section of the interview focuses on early mathematics concepts for children beginning school and this is the assessment completed at Best Start by the Kindergarten students.

The principles underlying the construction of the tasks and the associated **Growth Points** were to:

- describe the development of mathematical knowledge and understanding in a form and language that was useful for teachers;
- reflect the findings of relevant international and local research in mathematics
- reflect, where possible, the structure of mathematics;
- allow the mathematical knowledge of individuals and groups to be described; and
- enable the identification of students who may be mathematically vulnerable.

The assessment tasks in the interview take approximately 30 minutes for each student and are administered by classroom teachers who followed a detailed script. Each child completes about 50 tasks in total, and given success with one task, the assessor continues with the next tasks in a domain for as long as a child is successful, according to the instructions in the script.

The MAI assessment provides the teachers with information that is *diagnostic*. That is it identifies for the teachers where the student is in terms of mathematical understanding. This then provides a starting point (through the allocation of a **Growth Point**) that the teacher uses to program specific teaching strategies that will further develop the student's understanding.

Should parents wish to find out their child's MAI results, they may speak with the teacher at the Parent Teacher Interviews to be held later this term.

Many schools conduct the MAI at the very start of the school year. At St Kieran's it was decided in previous years, after analysing data quite thoroughly – that by allowing the students some time to settle into their new class; meet and establish a connection with their new teacher, the MAI results gained at this time would be more reflective of their true ability. This is why we administer the MAI a few weeks into Term One of the school year.

Compass Attendance: recording a full days absence on your mobile app

If your child is unwell and will be absent for a full day you can record their absence using the Mobile app. You can also schedule full day's absences in advance. For example, if your child will be absent for one or more days later in the term.

Please DO NOT use the mobile app to record a late arrival or early departure. These must be done at the kiosk near reception when you drop off or pick up your child. This ensures accuracy of who is on site at any given time.

A reminder that children must always be accompanied by a parent when arriving late to school. They cannot sign themselves in.

If your child is absent in the morning when the roll is marked and you haven't advised the school you will receive an SMS. Even if you have advised the school that your child will be arriving late you still may receive this SMS. In this case please ignore it.
