Dear Families

The Season of Lent began this week with Ash Wednesday marking the start of forty days of preparation for Easter. During Lent, we remember Jesus' time in the desert leading up to the events that we call Holy Week. Fr Paul reminded us at Mass that Lent is an opportunity to realign our "compass" with God who is the "true north". Jealousy, greed or other "de-magnetising" actions prevent us receiving being close to God. I encourage you this Lent to work on realigning your compass to the "true north".

Week 7 each term is *Fallow Week*. It is the one week in the term when our school set time aside for our community to focus on quality family time, without the pressures of extra meetings, homework etc. I encourage you to plan some time as a family to take advantage of the quieter week. Following feedback from last year's survey on school communication, the school will no longer publish the *Learning Quarterly* each Fallow Week. Instead, content that was normally included will be published regularly throughout the term in the newsletters.

Next Friday is *National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence*. The message continues to be "Bullying. No Way!" but rather than focus on the message for one day, we will remember that bullying and violence are not tolerated any time. Students will be taking part in activities next Friday to mark the day.

The **Parents and Friends Association** met last Monday evening where many items were discussed. The P&F is the major support group for building a strong community at St Kieran's and is vital in engaging parents in the life of

the school. This Saturday evening is one of those key events with the Welcome gathering at Wakehurst Golf Club. I look forward to meeting many of our new and existing families at this enjoyable evening.

There are many events that happen during the year at St Kieran's which rely upon the generosity of our parents in volunteering time to ensure that these are successful. Some of these events include the election BBQ on Sat 23 March, Mother's Day BBQ in May and even the Parish Colour Run which requires volunteers from the school. I strongly encourage you in the "busyness" of our lives to volunteer in some way to help strengthen the wonderful community that is St Kieran's. As initiated in 2016, we will be holding our Parent Teacher Interviews at the end of Term One. This came about as a result of feedback from data gained through our Parent Survey which was held a few years ago. In order to facilitate the organisation around this, I ask that you please read the instructions below carefully. Our Online Booking System ensures that parents are able to book times that are convenient to them, with ease.

ONLINE BOOKING FOR PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS. Below is an explanation of how to book your time for the Parent Teacher Interviews which will be held before the end of this term <u>during Weeks 9 and 10.</u>

You will be able to access the School Interview website (in order to make bookings) from **Monday 11 March** until **Friday 22 March.** It will be **closed** at 3.00pm on Friday March 22nd.

These interviews will involve all grades from Kindergarten to Year 6. Parents of children in Years K-6, <u>please follow</u> the prompts below.

Please follow the simple instructions below... Go to <u>www.schoolinterviews.com.au</u> and enter the code **qvab9**



Enter your details



Select the teachers you wish to see



Select the appointment times that suit your family best



When you click FINISH, your selected bookings will be emailed to you immediately. If you do not receive your email, please check your junk-mail, or enter the event code again and check your email address spelling. Update your details if email address if incorrect.

DO NOT DELETE the email you receive. Keep it somewhere safe. You may need to refer back to it at a later date.

REMEMBER TO ADD YOUR APPOINTMENTS TO YOUR CALENDAR - reminders will not be sent home.

Please note – Interview times have been organised into 15 minute timeslots as the actual interview is **15 minutes** in duration.

For parents who have more than one interview, please ensure that you <u>do not book</u> consecutive interviews but that you <u>allow at least 15 minutes between your interviews</u> in order to allow for a smoother and more time efficient "flow" to the interviews. This new booking system, in fact, will not allow parents to make two consecutive bookings.

Please find attached to this Newsletter a form which parents should **print out** and **fill in**, returning it then to the <u>appropriate classroom teacher</u>. This form assists teachers to better inform you of key issues you may wish to discuss regarding your child. We ask that you return the form to the class teacher **as soon as possible**. Thank you in anticipation of your attention to this!

Parents of children in 2HR, please note! If you require a booking on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday – you will be meeting with Wendy Rose. If you require a booking on a Thursday or Friday you will be meeting with Karen Hughes. Both teachers have collaborated on the preparation for these interviews but due to the days they are working, they will conduct interviews on corresponding days.

Also....The children in Years 2-6 are expected to attend and <u>be involved</u> in the interview process. We believe that students are <u>empowered</u> when included in this process. Research shows us that children who reflect on their learning are better able to plan for future learning, set goals and accept responsibility for their learning journey. These are the skills we aim to develop in our students at St Kieran's because we believe they are valuable aptitudes to have as members of modern society in the 21st century. Have a lovely weekend.






