Year 4 Science and Technology Incursion



Yesterday Year 4 had a visit from Jules and Tim from the Northern Beaches Council to teach us about our Living World.

They began the visit with a presentation about Bees. We learnt that bees are imperative to the survival of other living things. We depend on them for food and they depend on us for protection in the form of a safe habitat. There are over 20 000 species of bees in our world, however not all bees sting.

Mid-morning, we made bee hotels out of empty plastic bottles, bamboo, lantana branches and banksia seed pods. Tim taught us that the Queen bee lays the eggs and the Worker bees feed the larvae.

One of the most exciting parts of the incursion was dissecting a squid. We did this to learn about its adaptations and features. One interesting thing that happened was taking the eyeball out. It needs eyeballs on the side of its head to sense its predators and / or prey.

Overall, today was a great day of learning for all of Year 4!
