# Learning and Teaching

The following information relates to the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD). As part of the relevant legislation, if a student is identified as having a disability, then they are to be included on the NCCD. Please read the <u>attached</u> information regarding the NCCD.

A child may be included in the school's NCCD collection of data due to a disability. The word "disability" simply refers to either a medical or learning need that requires extra support or adjustments to be made. If your child is included in the school's NCCD, the class teacher will inform you of this at the Parent/Teacher Interviews to be held at the end of this term.

#### Does my child have a disability?

Your child may be included for a Diagnosed or Imputed Disability.

A diagnosed disability includes one that has been diagnosed by a paediatrician, medical practitioner or other allied health professional (i.e. psychologist, speech pathologist, etc).

An imputed disability is 'something that someone believes another person has. To impute a disability the school team must have reasonable grounds to make such a judgement.' (NCCD Website: 2019). Your child's school will have collected data to inform this decision.

#### What does this mean for my child?

Your child will receive adjustments based upon the functional impact of their disability at school. Throughout a child's schooling life, the level of required adjustment/s may change.

What does the support look like? Most students will receive adjustments from their classroom teacher in consultation with the Learner Diversity team. Recommendations also from external professionals who may have worked with students will be considered. Adjustments typically implemented by the classroom teacher could include, e.g., modifying tasks or providing extra assistance in curriculum areas. For some students, intervention may be organised so that they work individually or as part of a small group with either myself as Learner Diversity teacher or with the Learning Support Assistant.

Will my child have an Individual Planning Meeting (IP)? Parents or Carers of students who require adjustments at higher levels may be invited to an Individual Planning Meeting. Most of the students on the NCCD for our school require adjustments that are not at high levels. If your child does require adjustments at higher levels, you will be contacted to meet to discuss these adjustments. Parents or Carers of students who require lower-level adjustments will have opportunities to speak with the class teacher at parent teacher meetings or on other occasions throughout the year. Please understand that you are always encouraged to contact your child's teacher to make an appointment to meet, should you wish to discuss anything in relation to the NCCD. Parent teacher meetings are scheduled to be held at the end of this term in Weeks 9 and 10. Should you require any further clarification, please do not hesitate to contact me at school.



#### Ash Wednesday Mass and the beginning of Lent

Year Five are preparing to lead our Ash Wednesday Mass, 10am Wednesday 22 February. Students in Year 2 -6 will be attending the Mass with parents and family welcome. Our Kindergarten and Year One students will participate in Ash Wednesday through an in-class liturgy and distribution of the ashes.

With Lent about to begin we need to think about how our children, aged five to twelve can participate in a positive manner. Lent is a time to spring clean our spiritual lives and a call to spiritual renewal. We ask our children to do extra and be more thoughtful about what they do during Lent rather than give up things. Lent in 3 minutes is a quick video about the purpose of Lent.

#### Family Prayer Packs

Prayer is a way of communicating and strengthening our relationship with God. Prayer can take many forms and one way that many people pray is as a family.

The pack has user friendly instructions and is tailored to your child's age. There is also a prayer cube for you to make and keep for your family. Families are invited to use the pack for one or two days then return it to school for another family to use. You are encouraged to add your family intentions to the book provided so other families can pray for you.


