Learning and Teaching

Students in Years 3 and 5 completed the NAPLAN assessments last term. This year has seen some changes to both the time of testing and the reporting of the results. Parents will receive the results sometime towards the middle of the year.

NAPLAN results provide schools with information on how their students have performed against the national average. A student's result is shown on an achievement scale for each test. The achievement scale shows increasing levels of knowledge, understanding and skills demonstrated in the assessments.

Results will be reported against **4 proficiency standards** rather than **numerical bands** as in previous years. Proficiency standards describe what students at each year level are expected to know and should be able to do in literacy and numeracy at the time of NAPLAN.

NAPLAN reports will contain 4 easy-tounderstand proficiency standards:

- Exceeding
- Strong
- Developing
- Needs additional support.

The new reporting standards will provide parents, carers and teachers with simpler and clearer information about how students are performing and identify where children may need additional support.

Religious Education




As the month of May draws to a close, the students participated in a special prayer devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary in church today led by Father Jojo. They placed
